

MEXICAN CANDIDATES

Open

- [Scholars](#)
 - This grant allows scholars to conduct research, dissertation research, and postdoctoral stays for recent doctoral graduates, and professorships. Those who want to pursue teaching must have at least five years of experience.
- [Mexico Studies Chair](#)

Senior scholars may pursue research and teach for a term in a prestigious US university as this grant allows them to expand their knowledge on topics related to Mexico and to the U.S.-Mexico relationships. This is most appropriate for those in Public Policy and Public Administration.
- [Hubert H. Humphrey](#)
 - The ideal candidate for this grant has at least five years of experience in public service and leadership potential. The Humphrey Fellowship is non-degree. Although there are academic components, this program allows them to grow as leaders and professionals through a stay of up to twelve months.
- [Fulbright Specialist Program](#)
 - Mexican Institutions may apply to this program, which provides short-term Fulbright grants of two to six weeks to qualified U.S. scholars. The program goals are to increase the number of U.S. scholars in Fulbright academic exchanges and to promote increased connections between U.S. and Mexican universities or institutions.

Closed (Open in October 2017)

- [Graduate Studies](#)
 - This grant allows for candidates to pursue graduate studies at any accredited U.S. institution and in any discipline. Along with partner agencies, COMEXUS aids grantees through the application process
- [Binational Business Internship](#)
 - Recent graduates or young professionals may apply for this particular grant, which allows them to intern with a U.S. company and also take a few courses per semester at an MBA level.

U.S.CANDIDATES

Open

- **Students (Close October 6, 2017)**
 - **Students: All Disciplines**
 - This grant provides US students at all degree levels (terminal Undergraduate, Master's or Ph.D.), the opportunity to pursue 9 months of research in Mexico. Applications will be accepted in all fields of study except Medicine, Veterinary Medicine and Odontology.
 - **Graduate Degree Program**
 - Opportunity for US candidates to complete a Master's or Ph.D. degree at a Mexican qualified academic institution. The Commission will fund up to 2 academic years for Master's and up to 3 academic years for Ph.D. All candidates will receive an initial academic year of funding with the approval of subsequent financial support subject to academic performance and availability of funds. Applications will be accepted in all fields of study except Medicine, Veterinary Medicine and Dentistry.
 - **Public Policy Initiative**
 - Pursuant to the Commission's interest in public policies, students conducting research in the areas of public administration or policies will be funded through a Fulbright-García Robles grant. Candidates at all degree levels (terminal Undergraduate, Master's or Ph.D.) will be considered.
 - **English Teaching Assistantship**
 - The English Teaching Assistantship (ETA) places a Fulbrighter in a Mexican school to provide assistance to teachers. English Teaching Assistants help teach the English language while serving as cultural ambassadors for U.S. culture. Host institutions range from kindergarten to university level as well as teaching-training institutes.
 - **Binational Business Internship**
 - During a ten-month period each grantee interns at a company or organization. At the same time, grantees take graduate classes at one of one of Mexico's most prestigious private universities, Instituto Tecnológico Autónomo de México (ITAM), with a focus on international business
- **Scholars (Close August 1, 2017)**
 - **Scholars: All Disciplines**
 - Teaching, Research or Teaching & Research: This award allows senior scholars to teach at the university level, engage in research or both, in the grantee's area of specialization. Grantees can also consult on curriculum, program and faculty development, and conduct seminars and workshops.

- **Carlos Rico**
 - This award offers an unparalleled opportunity to conduct a research project in both Canada and Mexico. The aim of the award is to enhance collaboration between leading North American scholars working on projects concerning important issues facing the United States, Mexico and Canada. This award can be held at any university, government agency or research institution in Canada and Mexico.
- **Border Scholar**
 - Teaching, Research or Teaching & Research: This award allows scholars at all levels to teach at a qualified Mexican university, engage in research or both, in any discipline relevant to U.S. - Mexico border relations.
- **Global Teaching English as a Foreign Language Award**
 - This award allows senior scholars to teach at the university level, engage in research or both, in the grantee's area of specialization. Grantees can also consult on curriculum, program and faculty development, and conduct seminars and workshops.
